Learning objectives

The course has the following objectives:

- To understand how multinational corporations coordinate operations and compete on a global/regional scale;
- To learn to analyse and discuss complex international management cases succinctly and comprehensively;
- To interpret academic papers in the field of International Management, draw meaningful conclusions, and present own insights and findings in writing.

The objectives of the Self-Study Module (SSM) are as followed:

- To interpret and synthesise findings of academic papers on a core topic of International Management and draw your own conclusions;
- To practise independent academic research and academic writing;
- To develop problem-solving and inter-personal skills of working effectively in a culturally-diverse group.

More details of the SSM will be provided in the course outline, which will be made available through Canvas.

Course content

Key International Management topics will be discussed, including corporate and international strategy, international market entry, international organisation, cross-cultural management, international alliances, and managing international managers.

Course structure and indications of the learning and teaching design

Sessions will be a mixture of lectures (incl. several guest speakers), case discussions, and small in-class assignments.

In the context of the Self-Study Module (SSM) student groups will produce an original paper in a subfield of International Management on the basis of scholarly papers.
